

Stories of the Lost

Aron Goldman Bodner was a barber by profession, born in Stary Sacz, Poland in 1906. He and his wife, Ruzi, were inmates in the Plaszow camp near Krakow before being deported to Auschwitz.

Artur Rubin was a trader, born in 1901 in Dobris, Czechoslovakia. His wife, **Truda**, was born in Dobris in 1907. They were deported to Auschwitz and murdered in 1944.

Bela Rodnianski was born in 1909 in the city of Novograd Severskiy, Ukraine. She was an accountant by profession. During the war she lived in Klinty, Russia, where she perished in 1941 at the age of 32.

Boris Tzeitin was born in 1911 in Kharkov, Ukraine. He married **Maria** Kogan, who was born in 1915 in Senno, Belorussia. They lived in Nikopol, Ukraine. Maria was shot at Kamenka Dneprovskaya in 1941. Boris fell at the front in 1943 while serving as a technician in the Red Army.

Edith Frank (née Anker) was born in Neuruppin, Germany, in 1914. She was a teacher and married to Max Frank.

Elly Weisz, the daughter of Iolanda Weisz, was born in Satu Mare, Romania. Elly was murdered in Auschwitz at age twenty-one.

Florika Liebmann was born in 1934 in Szeged, Hungary, to Bela and Szerena Liebmann. She and her mother were deported and murdered in 1944.

Gabor Neuman was born in Békéscsaba, Hungary in 1940 to Alek and Margit Neuman. He was just four years old when he was deported to Auschwitz and murdered.

Gisi Fleischmann was born in Bratislava, Slovakia (then Pressburg, Austria-Hungary), in 1892. She was a Zionist activist and a leader the Bratislava Working Group. She was murdered in Auschwitz in 1944.

Hannah (Pilizer) **Joskowitz** was born in Lodz around 1900 and married to Yaacov Joskowitz. Their daughter, **Zhunia**, was born in the mid-1930s. Mother and daughter were both murdered in the Chelmno death camp.

Heinrich Jacoby was born in Belgard, Germany, in 1864. His wife **Margarete** was born in Eidtkonen, Germany, in 1875. They were deported from Germany and died in Theresienstadt in 1943.

Helga Hamm was born in 1930 in Berlin to Willi and **Margherita (Rubinfeld) Hamm**. Margherita (Grete) was born in 1907, also in Berlin.

Henryk Berush Szwarc was born in Zgierz, Poland in 1893. He was a clothing manufacturer in Lodz, married to Mala Eder. He was murdered at Majdanek in 1943.

Joseph Broudo was born in Salonika, Greece. He lived there all his life, as a merchant, married to Marie Varsano. The details of his death are unknown.

Mara Coblic, daughter of Yitzhak and Bracha Coblic, was born in 1936 in Chisinau, Romania (today Moldova). She and her mother died in the Chisinau Ghetto in 1940.

Rudi Salmang was born in Aachen, Germany in 1898. He was a clerk, married to Mia Frings. Prior to the war, he lived in Aachen but he moved to Brussels, Belgium during the war. He was murdered in Auschwitz.

Tema Sznajderman was born in Warsaw in 1917. During the war, she served as a courier for the resistance, bringing news, encouragement, money, and instructions for making grenades to the resistance in the ghetto. She was killed during the first uprising.

William Wolf Zeev Kohn was born in Vancsod, Hungary in 1885. He was a merchant in Bratislava, Czechoslovakia, married to Maria Fisher. He was murdered in Auschwitz in 1944.

Zvi Segal was born in Romania and lived in Mihaileni. He was married to Nisla Nussem and made a living as a trader. He had one son who survived the Holocaust. Zvi was sent to Kopaygorod, Ukraine, and was murdered there at age seventy-six.
